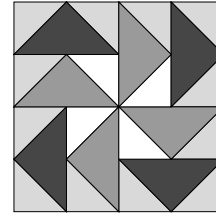



Dutchman's Puzzle


Instructions are given for an eight (twelve) inch block.


- Dutchman's Puzzle is a simple four-patch block – that is, it is made up from four smaller units.
- It is best made to finish at a size that is a multiple of 4 – i.e. 8inches or 12inches etc.
- You will need a minimum of three fabrics including a background.




Cutting

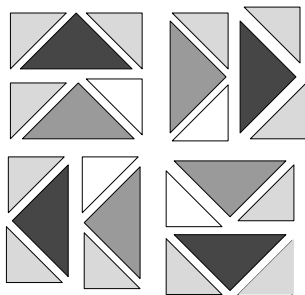
 From background cut:
6, $2\frac{7}{8}$ " ($3\frac{7}{8}$ ") squares; cut in 2 diagonally

 From light cut:
2, $2\frac{7}{8}$ " ($3\frac{7}{8}$ ") squares; cut in 2 diagonally.

 From medium cut:
1, $5\frac{1}{4}$ " ($7\frac{1}{4}$ ") squares; cut in 4 diagonally.

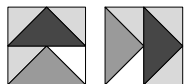
 From dark cut:
1, $5\frac{1}{4}$ " ($7\frac{1}{4}$ ") squares; cut in 4 diagonally.

Making the block

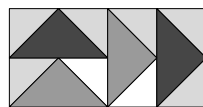
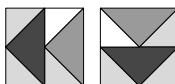


Lay block pieces out as shown.

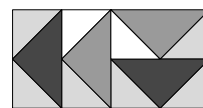
Stitch the units



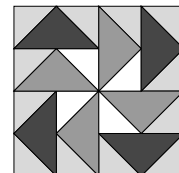
Sew units into pairs



Stitch the pairs together.

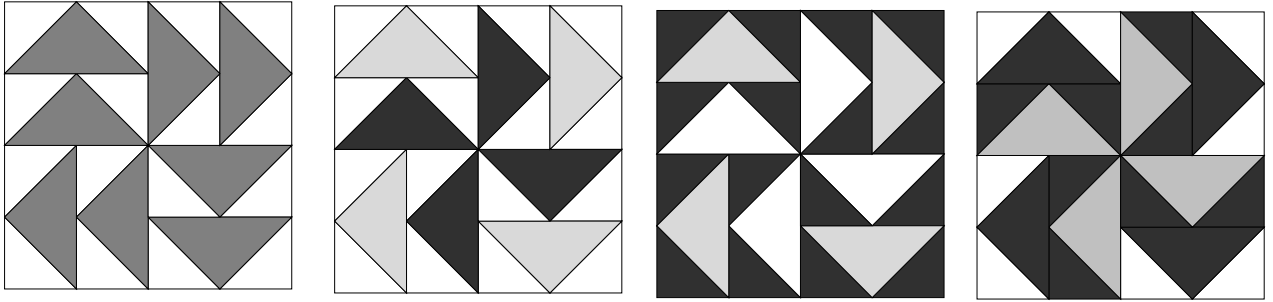


Stitch the two rows to complete Dutchman's Puzzle.



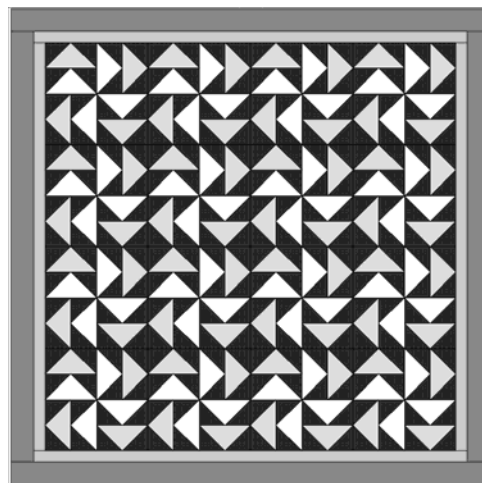
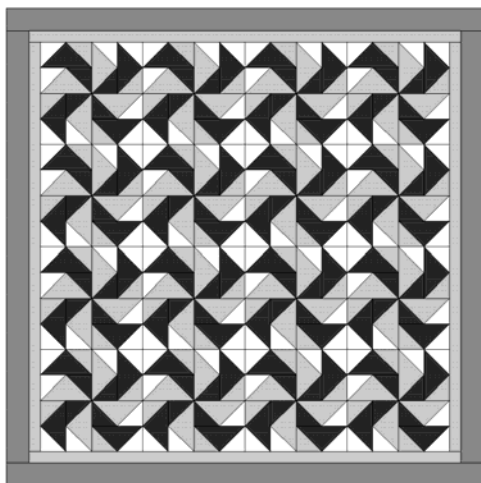
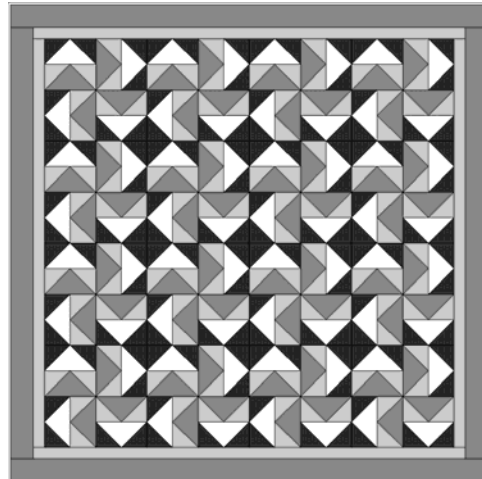
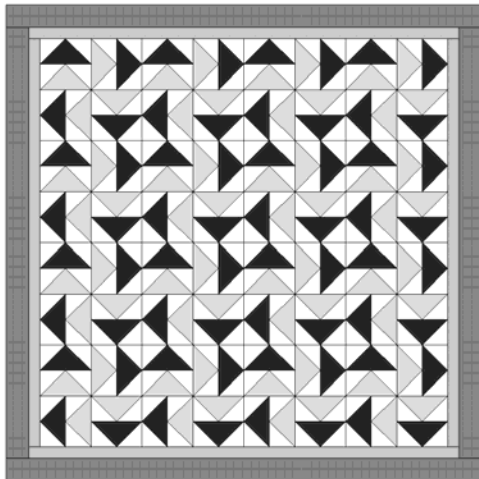
Ideas

Change the colour placement within the block

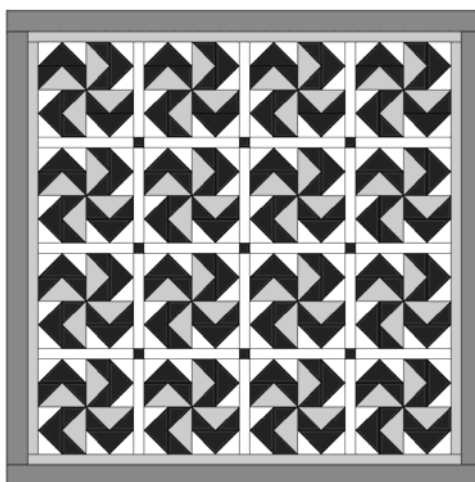
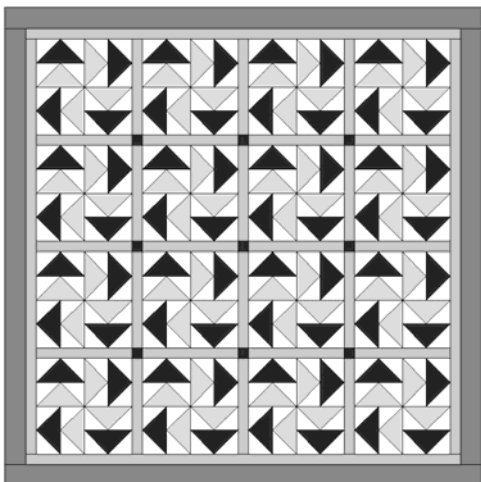


Put blocks into quilts

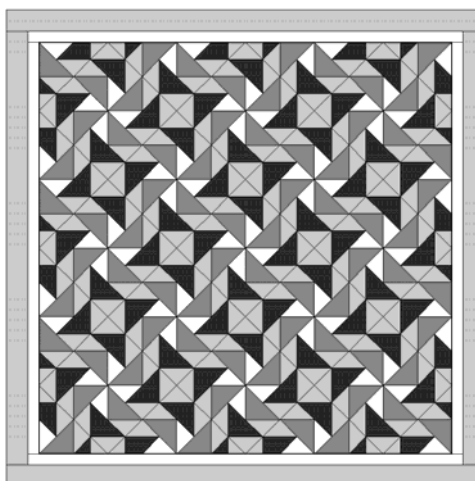
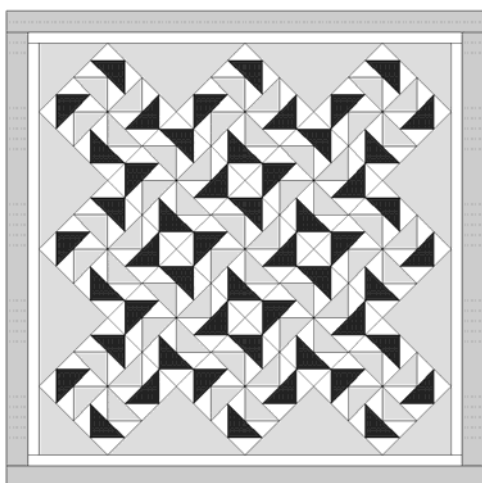
Straight 4 x 4 settings



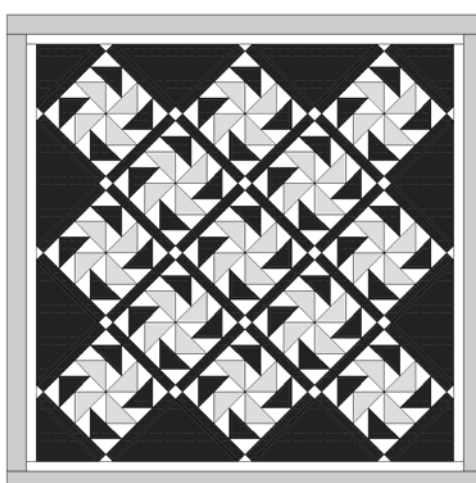
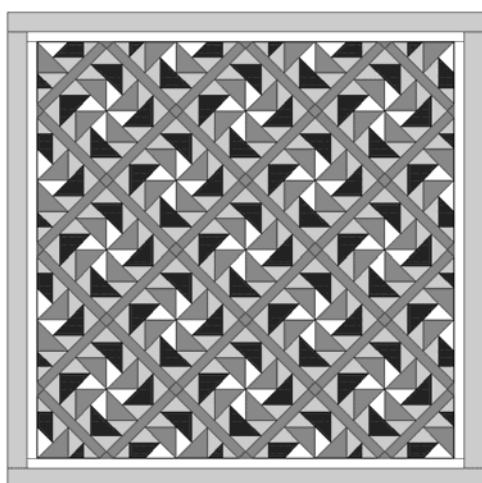
Add sashing



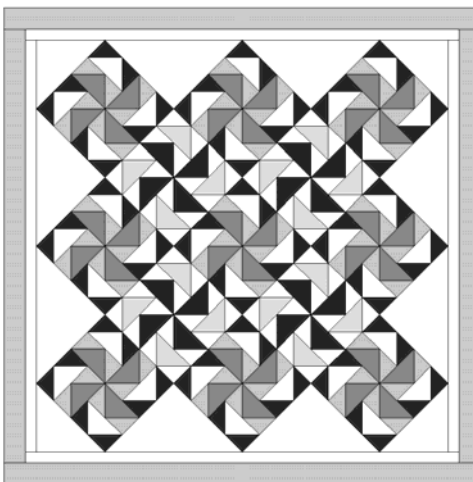
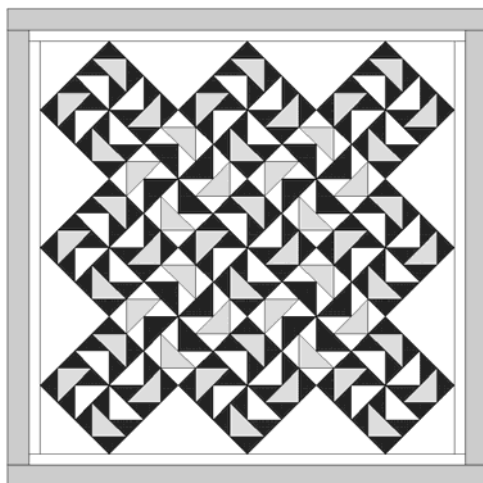
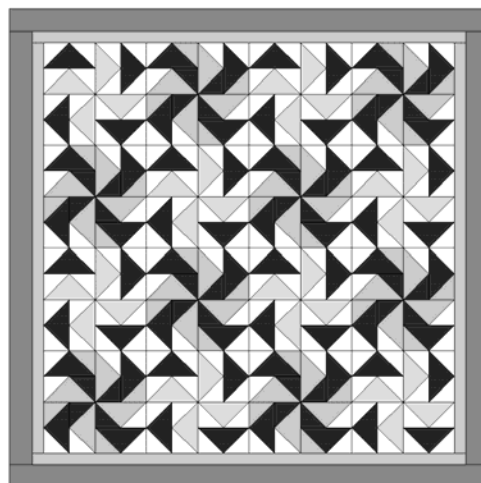
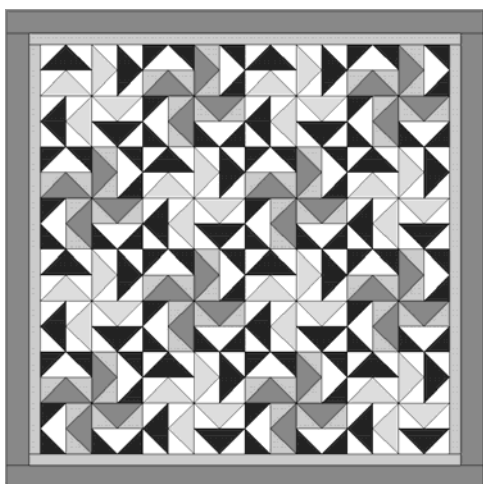
Put the blocks on point
