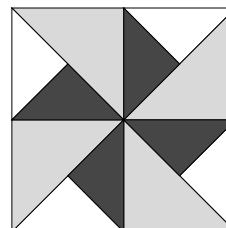



Turnstile


Instructions are given for an eight (twelve) inch block.


- Turnstile is a simple four-patch block – that is, it is made up from four smaller units.
- It is best made to finish at a size that is a multiple of 4 – i.e. 8 inches or 12 inches etc.
- You will need three fabrics including a background.



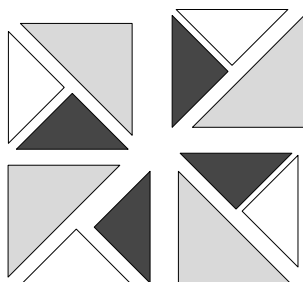
Cutting

 From light cut:
1, 5¼" (7¼") square; cut 4 diagonally

 From dark cut:
1, 5¼" (7¼") square; cut 4 diagonally

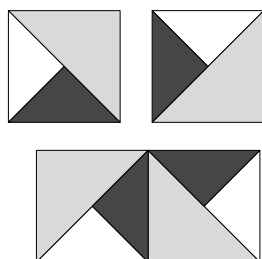
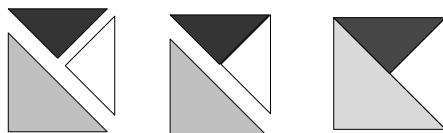
 From medium cut:
2, 4⅞" (6⅞") squares; cut in 2 diagonally

Making the block

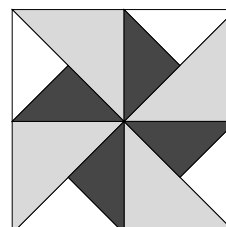


Lay out block pieces as shown.

Stitch units

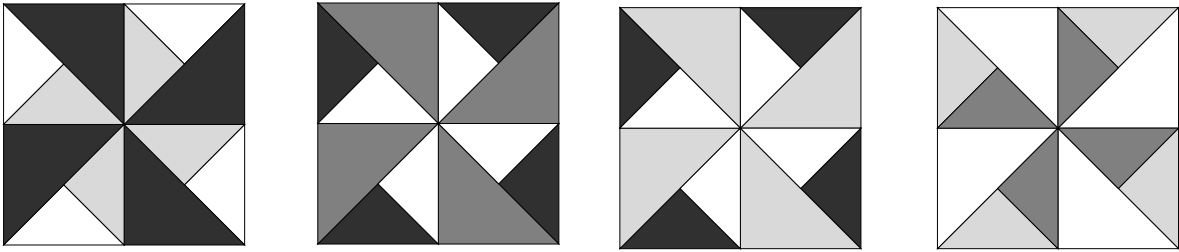


Stitch units into pairs then into four to complete Turnstile block.



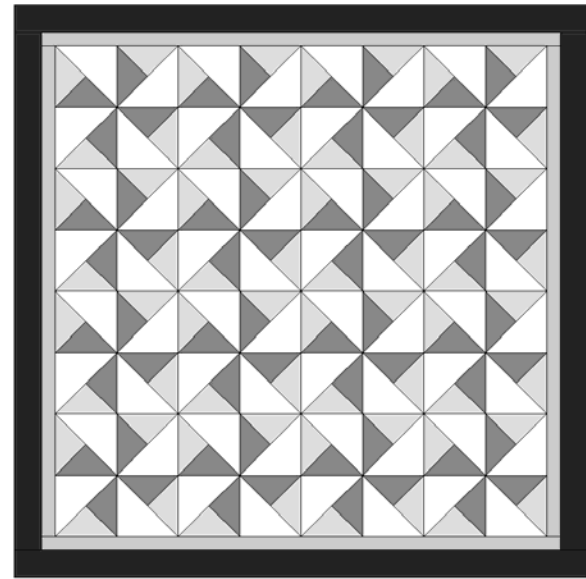
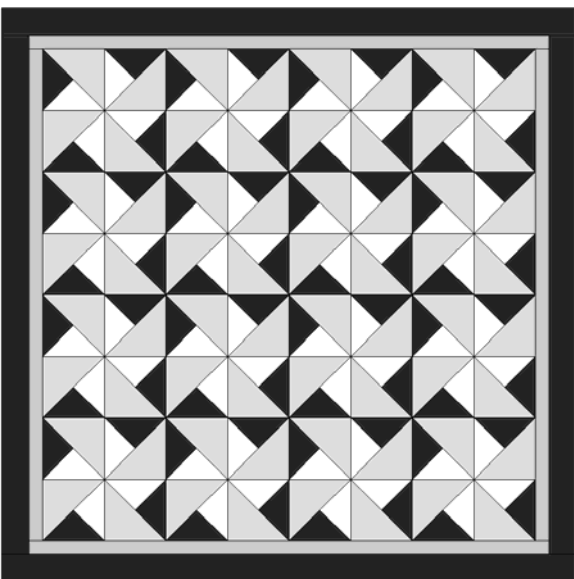
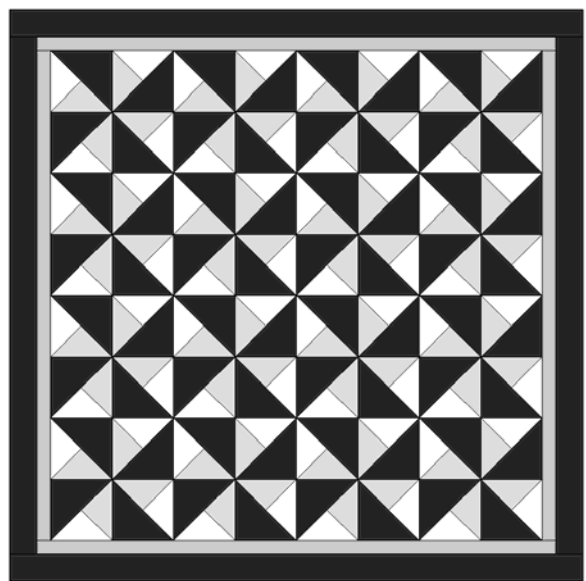
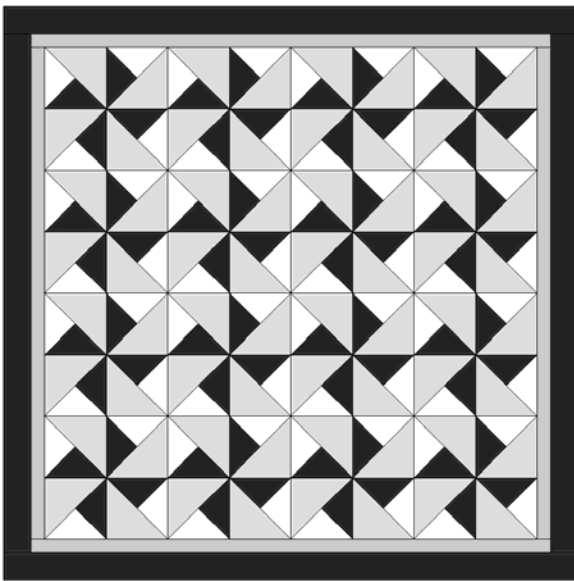
Ideas

Change the placement of light and dark, or add another shade (or two).

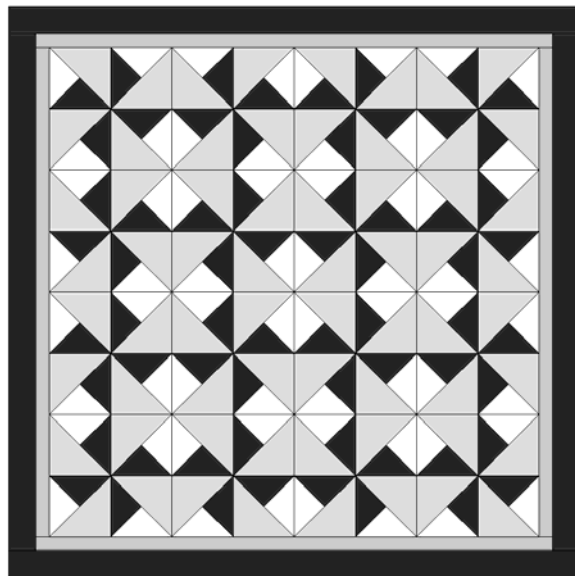
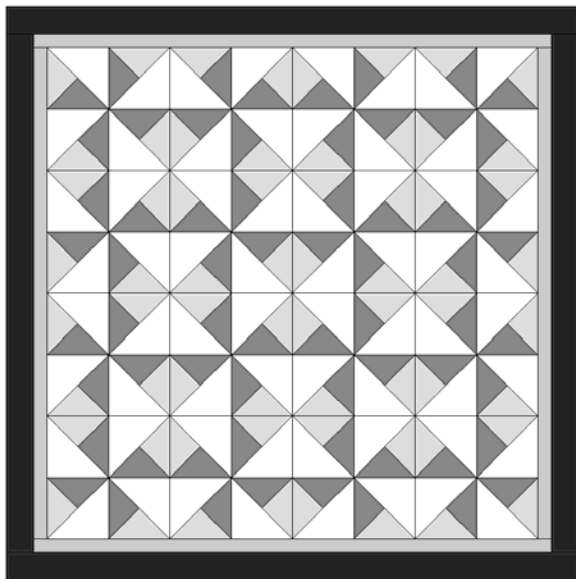


Put the block into a quilt

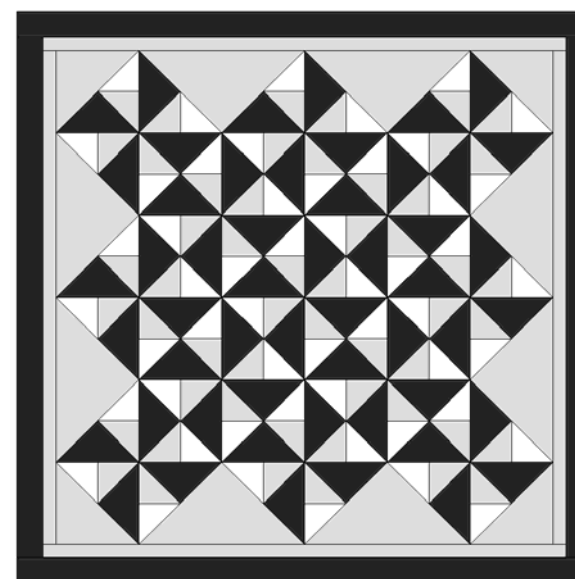
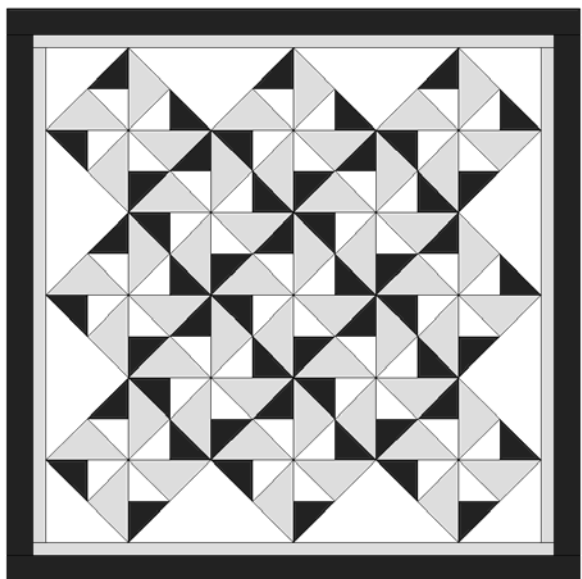
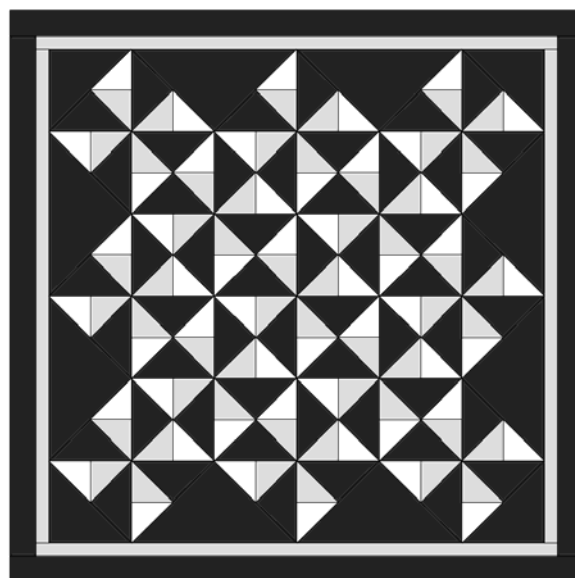
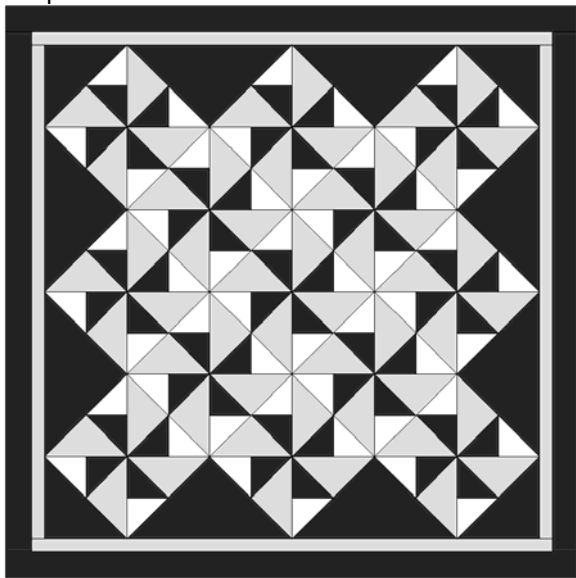
Straight set 4 x 4 blocks



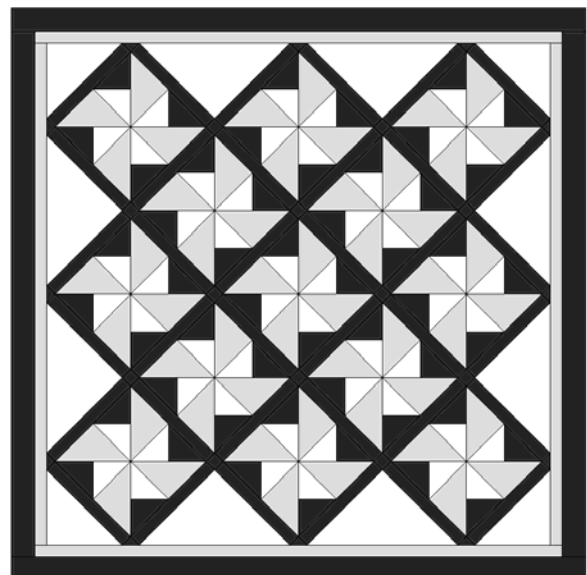
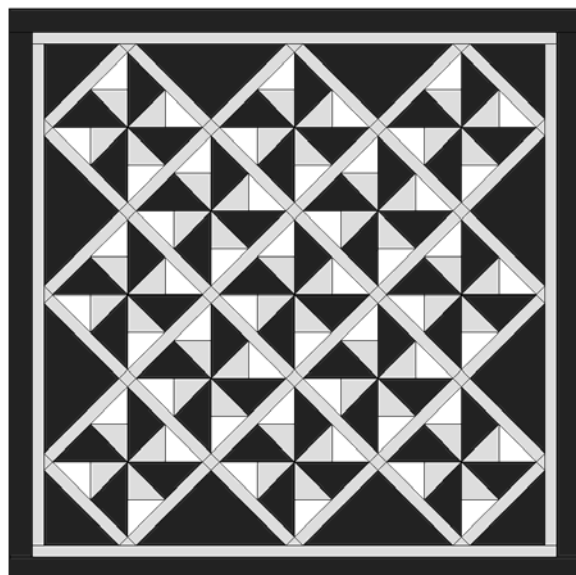
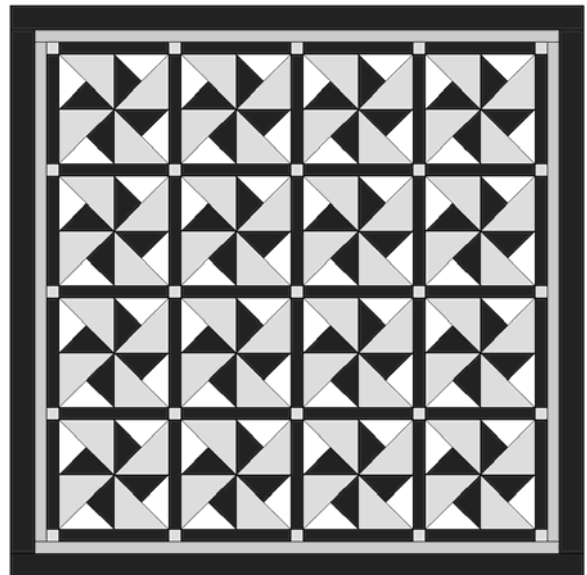
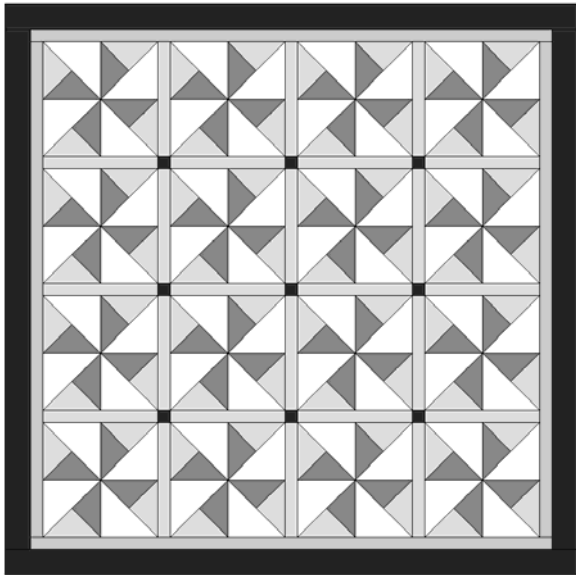
The block is symmetrical, but if alternate blocks are mirror images ...



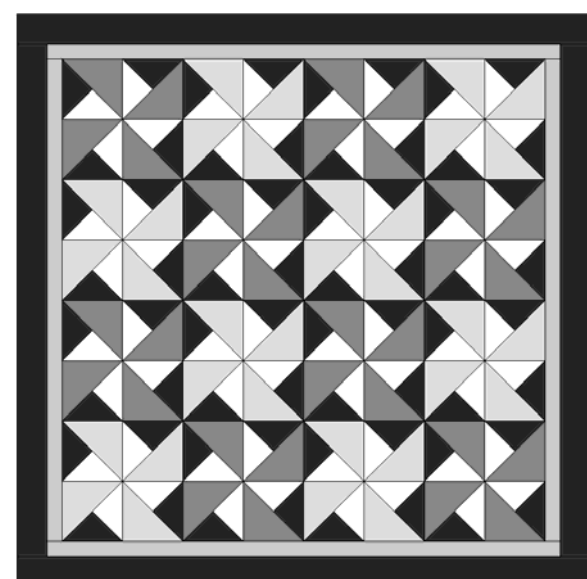
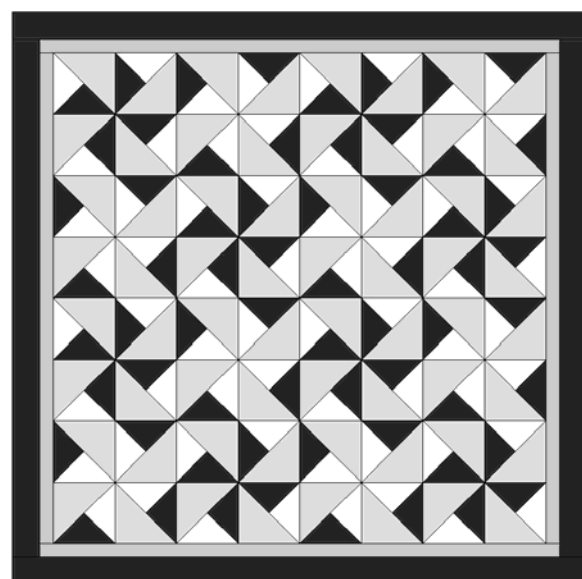
